What is the relevance or “point” of this frequency?

1. The narrative structure (“where the ‘/’ belong between the verses”)

2:1: Joshua sends the 2 spies out

2:2–7: *Rahab sends out the men from Jericho*

2:8–14: A rooftop covenant / profession of faith

2:15–22: *Rahab sends out the spies*

2:23–24: Joshua receives the 2 spies back

2:9a: Yahweh has given the land

2:9b: *our hearts melted*

2:10a: exodus

2:10b: conquest of Sihon and Og (Num. 21:21–25, 31–35)

2:11a: *hearts melted*

2:11b: Yahweh is God of heaven and earth

3. Evidences of Rahab’s faith

3.1 Heb. 11:31: she received the spies with peace

3.2 She hid the spies (vv. 4–6)

3.3 She believed that Yahweh had given Israel the land (vv. 8—9)

3.4 She exhibited unconditional and total surrender to Yahweh: “God of heaven and earth”

3.5 She exhibited hope, rather than despair (like the Canaanites, v. 11a)

3.6 She hung a scarlet cord from her window (v. 21)

3.7 Joshua 6:22–25: she left her prostitution behind

3.8 She received the spies at great risk (James 2:25)

3.9 She sent the spies out by another route (James 2:25)

3.10 Ruth 4:18–22
